RESOLUTION 2021-03 FEE SCHEDULE

WHEREAS, Worley Highway District has reviewed certain fees recommended by the Associated Highway Districts of Kootenai County, Idaho; and

WHEREAS, Idaho Code 63-1311 permits taxing districts to impose and cause to be collected fees for those services provided by that district which would otherwise be funded by property tax revenues.

WHEREAS, Worley Highway District incurs costs associated with the handling of Permits, Subdivisions, Variance Requests, Right-of-Way Vacation/Abandonment/Validation, and Appeals; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners deems it advisable that the petitioner pay a fee to cover the cost of legal fees, staff time and expenses in conjunction with Permits, Subdivisions, Variance Requests, Right-of-Way Vacation/Abandonment/Validation, and Appeals; and

WHEREAS, the Board of Commissioners deems it advisable that these recommended fees be adopted.
